GRADE 2- Module 12: Genre Study Literary Texts

Mission Statement

Unit/Module Overview

This writing module focuses on developing students' ability to write a clear and well-structured opinion essay. The unit begins with the introduction of a focal text, allowing students to preview and analyze the structure and language of opinion writing. Through vocabulary exploration and discussions of text elements, students build the foundational knowledge needed to express their viewpoints effectively. In the prewriting phase, they learn to identify and articulate their own opinions while reviewing essential grammar concepts such as possessive pronouns, quotation marks, and irregular verbs.

As students progress through drafting and revising, they learn how to organize their ideas logically and use linking words to connect reasons and evidence. Grammar lessons throughout support strong sentence construction, including subject-verb agreement, the correct use of commas, and the application of adjectives and articles. In the final phase, students focus on editing for clarity and punctuation before publishing a final copy of their opinion essay. The module concludes with students sharing their writing, reinforcing their ability to express personal viewpoints with clarity, structure, and proper grammar.
