Into Reading Module 1

Content Area: Writing
Course(s): Writing 2
Time Period: September
Length: 3 Weeks

Module Overview

This personal narrative writing module guides students through the process of writing about their own experiences while reinforcing key grammar skills. The module begins by priming students and the text to activate background knowledge and build interest in narrative writing. Students read and analyze a mentor text, explore vocabulary, and are introduced to the stages of the writing process. During prewriting, they prepare and organize their ideas, learning to structure their stories with a beginning, middle, and end. As they draft, students apply narrative elements such as characters, setting, and events. Revising lessons focus on word choice and enhancing the clarity and impact of their writing, followed by peer conferencing and feedback.

Throughout the unit, grammar instruction is embedded to support sentence construction and improve writing quality. Students review subjects and predicates, work with nouns and action verbs, and learn to write complete, simple sentences using correct word order. Lessons also address common issues such as run-on sentences, and introduce different types of sentences—statements, questions, commands, and exclamations—to add variety and tone to their narratives. Editing focuses on correct use of possessives and contractions, preparing students to proofread, publish, and share their final personal narratives. This module helps students express themselves through storytelling while building strong foundational grammar skills.
