

Second Chance Learning- Request to Reassess Form: CHS Mathematics Department (as of 1/29/19)

Guidelines:

- Students may redo one quiz or one test per marking period with the exception of the quarterlies/unit exams which cannot be re-done.
- Students must have completed a minimum of 75% of homework, classwork, and review materials, with appropriate work, for the specific content in order to be eligible for the retake on that content.
- Students must have made a good-faith effort to complete the original assessment, which includes timely and thoughtful completion of work and appropriate use of class time and resources, to be eligible for the retake.
- Student's grade will be the calculated average of the original assessment and the reassessment.
- No SCL opportunities will be allowed within the last 5 school days of a marking period, regardless of when a quiz or test is scheduled to be administered. **Last assessment of the marking period may not be eligible for SCL.**
- Students who do not show up for a scheduled SCL will forfeit their SCL for this marking period.

Procedure:

- Complete this form by the deadline stated and submit to the teacher.
- If necessary, make an appointment to meet with your teacher to discuss the original assessment and strategies you will use to improve your understanding.
- Upon approval of request, schedule a time with the teacher to take the reassessment.
- Complete evidence of remediation and then reassessment.
